**DSCA Deputy Director Announced:
Richard J. Millies to take #2 Position in Defense Security Cooperation**

Lieutenant General Tome Walters USAF, Director of the Defense Security Cooperation Agency (DSCA), today announced the appointment of Richard J. Millies as Deputy Director. Mr. Millies replaces Arthur R. Keltz, who retired.

Mr. Millies will become the senior civil servant in the agency which administers a variety of Defense programs, including the DoD humanitarian and demining program, the International Military Education and Training Program, and the Foreign Military Sales program. The FMS program alone does over \$12 billion in business each year.

Mr. Millies, a member of the Senior Executive Service, is currently director of policy in the Office of the Deputy Undersecretary of the Air Force For International Affairs. He is a graduate of Fordham, Southern Illinois and Georgetown Universities, and has attended senior courses of instruction at both Harvard University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Mr. Millies has a long career spent in public service. He has been an officer in the US Air Force, an analyst at the Office of Management and Budget, a logistician at the Military Sealift Command, and an intelligence analyst at the Drug Enforcement Administration before beginning service at Headquarters, U.S. Air Force in 1985. He has worked in a variety of positions at HQ USAF, with his most recent position being the director of policy in the Office of the Deputy Undersecretary of the Air Force for International Affairs. He has also served in various positions as an officer in the Air Force Reserve for 20 years.

“Richard Millies will be a valuable part of our team” said General Walters. “He brings a wide range of experience and a broad set of skills to DSCA. He has a proven track record of success on a broad range of issues with diverse organizations. He is equally at home dealing with agencies within the Beltway or countries around the world.”

Mr. Millies will assume his DSCA duties in September.
